Dear Hawk Parents,

OHS Homecoming week is September 16th-21st. This is a week of good times and memories for all. The Homecoming Dance will take place on September 21st, 2019. Members of OHS student council have worked diligently to ensure the dance is fun for everyone. It is important to know and understand the expectations of all students attending the dance.

Dress Code

- Expectations for dress:
 - Dresses must be an appropriate length - *In instances where a dress is too short, dance chaperones may ask students to wear shorts under their dress. Extra shorts will be on hand.*
 - No tube skirts are allowed. This includes tube skirts as part of a dress.
 - Spaghetti straps and strapless dresses will be allowed at the homecoming dance as long as coverage is still appropriate.

*** If you believe a dress is questionable, please bring it into Ms. Cremeens, Mrs. Mowry, or Dr. Deininger for approval as soon as possible to avoid being turned away on the night of the dance for dress code violations.*

- Pants must be worn at the waist
- All shirts must remain buttoned up and worn throughout the dance

Dancing

- Students must be upright at all times
- Hands on waist only
- Lewd or suggestive conduct at dances, including acts on the dance floor will not be tolerated

*** It is the responsibility of OHS students to make sure their guests know the dance and dress expectations*

Students will receive a wristband at the start of the dance. The student's wristband will be cut off if they are in violation of OHS handbook policies or dance policies. The wristband being cut off serves as a warning for students who are in violation of handbook or dance policies. If a student is in violation at any point after their wristband is cut off, they will be asked to leave the dance.

THE HOMECOMING DANCE IS A SCHOOL FUNCTION. As such, all school rules apply for OHS and non-OHS students equally. Once students enter the building, they will NOT be allowed to leave and re-enter. Anyone dressed inappropriately will be turned away at the door.

Anyone suspected to be, or presenting as, under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be referred to the on-site police officer and not allowed into the dance. All code of conduct expectations for appropriate behavior apply to the Homecoming dance. Refusal to follow expectations will result in removal from the dance and further school consequences.
